VI. Reports

City Manager Robert Straebel reported that the City has met with the Federal Aviation Administration and has found that the FAA will not fund a general aviation terminal, only a commercial terminal. The City will need to redesign the plans accordingly. The Airport Advisory committee will tentatively meet on April 11, 2012 at 2 p.m. to begin this process, which must move quickly to take advantage of grant funds that have already been allocated to the project. City Manager Straebel also reported that the City's matching portion of the grant has increased from two and one-half percent (2.5%) to a five percent (5%) match.

City Manager Straebel provided copies of the Clinton Street Improvements bid tab to City Council. MDC was the low bidder. Due to the number of bid options and the fact that 2011-12 fund balances have not been finalized, City Staff needs additional time to evaluate bid options and will bring the matter to Council for consideration at the next meeting, April 16. Staff anticipates having the project underway in late summer or early fall. The Clinton Street project will go from Bridge Street to Grant and will include the White parking lot. Due to concerns about the longevity of porous pavement, Staff does not anticipate using this type of pavement but instead will increase storm water management. The project will include conduit for an electric charging station and grants are being pursued to offset some of the costs.

VII. Requests, Petitions and Communications and Actions Thereon

A. Revised Lease Agreement for the Use of Charlevoix's North and South Piers with the Army Corps of Engineers

City Manager Rob Straebel was available to address the item and answer questions from Council. City Staff has been working with Army Corps of Engineers representatives on the adoption of regulations pertaining to swimming in the Pine River Channel. According to the Corps, the City must adopt a revised Management/Development Plan. This plan enacts policing powers on the pier to enforce regulations for "no swimming" in the channel and also calls for signage and possibly surveillance cameras.
