#### VI. Reports

The City Manager gave an update on the Fireplace Design Steering Committee. The Manager clarified that the committee is not set up to say yes or no to the fireplace; they are there to design it and address issues with the design. Their next meeting will be February 28.

The Manager stated that they had hoped to present the revised airport fees at this meeting, but that Airport Manager Scott Woody would like some more time to do research. They plan to have something for Council's consideration at the February 18 meeting.

## VII. Requests, Petitions and Communications and Actions Thereon

# A. <u>Consideration of Paddleworks Mobile Rental of Kayaks and Paddleboards at City Beaches</u>

Bill Schulman reviewed his request to rent kayaks and paddleboards at Depot and/or Ferry Beach. The Manager said that staff has reviewed the request and ironed out some of the details. The Manager answered various questions regarding the location of the operations. Staff has addressed possible conflicts with the sailing school. Council expressed concerns that the Chicago Club might object to that location. The Manager stated that he thought there would be minimal conflicts with the Chicago Club as the business will be a day operation only. The Clerk said that the location at the south end of Depot beach had been used for the sailing school in the past.

The Mayor called for public comment at 7:09 p.m.

Jeff Porter stated that the sailing school is a non-profit operation. This would be a for profit operation. The Clerk clarified that Paddleworks would be operating as a roadside stand, and would be required to pay for the appropriate licenses. Staff had felt this business offers the types of amenities the City wishes to provide. The Mayor stated that Paddleworks is also required to provide proof of insurance and liability.

The Mayor closed public comment at 7:10 p.m.

Council asked additional questions. The rentals will operate outside the swimming area. The permit is for one season, and if it doesn't work out the City does not have to continue it. Staff will bring the item back to Council after the season is over to review and get their input before continuing the operation.

Motion by Councilmember Dennis Kusina, seconded by Councilmember Shane Cole, to authorize Schulman Paddleworks to use the south end of Depot Beach and the north end of Ferry Beach to rent kayaks and paddleboards to beach patrons, with the condition that they (1) provide the City with liability insurance, which names the City as co-insured; (2) has its patrons sign a Release of Liability prior to renting the kayaks/paddleboards; (3) acquire all necessary licenses from the Clerk's office; and (4) the mobile rental must conform with the City's zoning ordinance and its sign regulations.

# B. Consideration to Approve the Sale of Property Located at the Intersection of Dixon Avenue and Mercer Boulevard

The Manager summarized the item. This is a purchase agreement with Todd Wyett for the sale of an approximately 4,900 square foot parcel of land at the intersection of Dixon Avenue and Mercer Boulevard for the appraised value of \$4,000. There is a blanket easement for the right-of-way for work on utilities or changes in the roadway. There is also a reverter clause that if the owner violates anything in the blanket easement and doesn't correct it within 14 days, the land would revert to the City. The Manager reminded Council that the land would no longer be public land, it would be private land, and the City would no longer have control over what happens to the trees unless they put some language regarding them in the purchase agreement. Mr. Wyett has no plans to remove the healthy trees in the near future, and he does not object to a clause, but he asked that if Council puts a clause in the agreement regarding the trees that it have a sunset on it of between 3 to 5 years. Council discussed the pros and cons of putting a tree provision in the agreement. Councilmember Vollmer said that, while he has nothing against Mr. Wyett, he does not see a benefit to the City in selling this piece of property. Mr. Wyett plans to landscape, water and maintain the property. The Attorney clarified for Council that, although Mr. Wyett has stated he does not have any immediate plans to remove the trees unless they are unhealthy,

he can sell the property to someone else who may not be as cooperative as Mr. Wyett. If Council is concerned about the trees and want some protections, they can't just go by Mr. Wyett's good faith.

The Mayor called for public comment at 7:22 p.m.

Jeff Porter asked if this property was within 300 feet of Lake Charlevoix. The Mayor said it is not. Selling property within 300 feet of the lake would need to go to a vote of the people.

Leon Perron asked if Council would address what could be added to the property, such as memorials. The Mayor stated the property would be no different than any other front yard. It is not a buildable piece of property. He can plant trees, plants, bushes, etc. If the City does any work on that property or accesses utilities in the easement, Mr. Wyett will be responsible for paying any reconstruction/refurbishing costs.

The Mayor closed public comment at 7:25 p.m.

Council generally agreed not to put a tree provision in the agreement.

Motion by Councilmember Jill Picha, seconded by Councilmember Shane Cole, to approve the sale of a parcel of city land approximately 4,918 square feet in area located at the corner of Dixon Avenue and Mercer Boulevard to the Todd A. Wyett 1995 Trust for the sale price of \$4,000.00, subject to the approval of the final language of the purchase agreement and quit claim deed, including the blanket easement and reverter clause, by the City Manager and City Attorney consistent with the directives of the City Council and to authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the purchase agreement, quit claim deed, and any other document necessary to close the transaction.

Policy makers would be individuals from the community appointed to commissions, committees, or elected to Council. Dr. Porter was taken back by the fact that Mr. Straebel was on the fireplace committee. Dr. Porter does not believe staff should be involved in policymaking decisions. He thinks Mr. Straebel should either resign from the committee or resign as City Manager.
